#### THE PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

I just returned from my trip to the Winter Nationals at the Ben Avery Range. It was a long hard drive but worth every minute. The scenery and terrain changes are enough to keep the long drive interesting plus the chance to see animals and birds that we've never seen before. Sad to say we did not see the big game animals we hoped to see but did see numerous birds and small game that were new to us. The Gambrel quail, doves and jack rabbits were a daily sight at the camp ground and occasionally a coyote would come through during the night. The shooting in Arizona is basically the same program as at Friendship but it just doesn't seem that way. There are separate ranges for each discipline except the offhand rifle and pistol are on the same range but segregated. I spent most of my shooting time on the skeet range an actually managed to take a medal in the flint daily qualifier while my travelling companion [ Alan Shourds ] took the championship in that division. I also managed to get in a couple rounds of silhouettes but my 45 caliber rifle was not up to the task of knocking down the targets beyond 100 yards. I also tried to shoot the smoothbore aggregate, suffice to say that I didn't do well.

On the local front, Lyle tells me that the ticket sales for the raffle gun went well at the Lapeer Show and hope that continues at Kalamazoo next weekend. Cal Mebon has offered help with the ticket sales there so Lyle and I can wonder the show a little bit.

At the Board Meeting in February Joe Valentin volunteered to make next year's raffle gun from a Jim Chamers kit and finish off this year's gun with some engraving which has been completed and Lyle assures me adds a lot to the gun. There has been 2 clubs express interest in hosting the State Shoot when we leave Grand Valley but no letters has been received as of yet. We are still looking for a powder horn to go with this year's raffle.

As we move forward into spring I hope to be getting to more shoots. I would like to have been at Linden today but I am still not recovered from the trip to Arizona. I also missed the Finger Nipper at Houghton Lake while I was gone but I have been informed that all who attended had a good time.

#### SPARKS FROM THE CAMPFIRE

**LAST BATTLE for FT. RENDEZVOUS First Day of Battle**: On the morning of Nov. 30, 1990, our president received a call from a local police commander asking permission to use our range

And trap house to hold a training session (trap shoot). Since their dues were paid, the president said the only restriction would be **fine shot only**, since there were houses in the proximity of our shot gun range - across the Little Manistee River. The commander agreed to these stipulations

And reassured him they would clean up and leave the property as they found it. Later that day, our then president ventured out to the range, saw law enforcement vehicles parked inside the gates and assumed the range was being used as previously arranged. As he drove away from the range property, a car flagged him down - it was a homeowner that lived north of the property. He was upset that bullets were falling like snow on his house and in his yard. When the homeowner was told who was using the range, he proceeded there to let the shooters know the circumstances – the officers sent him packing. When the homeowner called the police station to report the incident, they called him a "crackpot." He was MAD AS HELL and called the prosecuting attorney who contacted a judge and got an injunction to permanently close our range. It became "locked down" to ALL members. We were also liable to be sued for residential

Damage, and there was nothing we could do about it. This set the stage for the impending battle.

#### CHECK THOSE POWDER HORNS

I was at the Winter Woods walk at Laingsburg this year and there was an accident with a powder horn. Apparently there was a question as to whether the person involved had put powder in his barrel during the loading process. Rather than take a chance on a dry ball he decided to flash his pan to clear the barrel in case there was powder in it. When we pulled the trigger the gun was low by his side and pointed at the ground. The flash from the pan ignited the man's powder horn through a small crack in it. The net result was a blown out horn and priming horn that was in his shot pouch and some burnt clothing. No injuries were sustained and there was no indication the person had done anything wrong as far as woods walk safety procedures [ie. his powder horn was plugged]. The man stated later that he had noticed a small crack in the horn but was more concerned about moisture than anything else. This could happen to any of us. It serves as a reminder to all that accidents can happen to any of us and check you horns for cracks. Any crack is too large.

All the members have done a fine job in sponsoring matches for the Michigan State Rifle Championships this year. I and the association thank you much for that. We have less than 8 Muzzle Loading clubs in the state of Michigan that have sponsored a match or matches.
